

Hosting a *Patrick King Horsemanship* Workshop

Open Horsemanship Workshop

Hosting an open horsemanship workshop with Patrick King Horsemanship is a great way to bring Patrick's unique perspective, program, and style of teaching to your area. All workshops are open to horses and riders of all breeds and disciplines, and focus specifically on the needs and goals of each horse and rider. Individual and small group (2-3 students) sessions are scheduled in hourly blocks. Workshops can be scheduled for one or multiple days.

Fees:

- ⇒ Standard individual lesson fee is \$50/hr.
- ⇒ Standard semi-private lesson fee is \$40/hr.
- ⇒ Mileage or air fare, if necessary, will be split evenly among the riders and added into the lesson fees.
- ⇒ Auditor fees are \$20/day, with multi-day discounts available

Host responsibilities:

- ⇒ Promote the workshop locally and regionally by distributing flyers, placing ads, etc. (Patrick King Horsemanship will provide a workshop flyer to be distributed, and will advertise via our website, e-newsletters and social media sites.)
- ⇒ Collect a 50% non-refundable deposit for each rider when they register for the workshop.
- ⇒ Collect final rider payments before their scheduled session.
- ⇒ Distribute and collect registration and release forms.
- ⇒ Arrange for morning coffee/juice/snacks, bottled water throughout each day, and lunch (this can be as simple as you directing participants to local restaurants or having food available for purchase.
- ⇒ Coordinate stalling and arena rental (if necessary).
- ⇒ Direct participants and auditors to parking, stalling, arena areas, etc.
- ⇒ Provide a space for Patrick King Horsemanship merchandise setup/sales.
- ⇒ Provide a paddock or stalling for Patrick's horses, when necessary.

Host benefits:

- ⇒ Workshop host/coordinator will receive one private rider space in the workshop to be used at their discretion (use it to ride, sell it, give it away, etc).
- ⇒ Promotion of your facility.
- ⇒ Stall/arena fees.
- ⇒ 25% of auditor fees collected.

Facility requirements:

- ⇒ Arena: We need a large enough area for the horses and riders to move around without much trouble. If you have a fenced arena, that's great. If you have a level field to work in, that's just as good. It's always a good idea to have a backup indoor arena in case of inclement weather.
- ⇒ Parking for trucks/trailers and auditor vehicles.
- ⇒ Stalls or paddocks available for horses that will be staying.
